Site Plan Requirements for Single-Family Building Permits

- What is a Site Plan? A site plan is an accurate, scaled drawing of a piece of property showing its size and shape, and the size, shape and precise location of all the man-made features (buildings, structures, driveways, utilities, etc.) on the property.

Required information to be shown on a Site Plan: (2 copies)

- Lot Number
- Subdivision Name
- Address of project
- Columbia County's Tax Lot & Map Number
- North arrow
- Scale of drawing
- Location of all <u>property lines</u> and property dimensions.
- □ Location, size and shape of all structure(s) proposed for construction.
- □ Location, sizes and shape of all structure(s) currently existing on the site.
- □ Dimensions of all actual building setbacks front, side, and rear.
- Finished floor elevation and Property Corner Elevation.
- <u>Driveway location</u> and dimensions. Must use current City details*.
- Identification of adjacent streets (by name), alleys or other adjacent public property.
- □ Location, dimensions and type of all easements on property.
- Sidewalk dimensions if adjacent to property, and street tree locations.
- <u>Utility connections</u> (i.e. locations of storm drainage, sanitary sewer and water line, including storm and sewer stub-outs).
- <u>Erosion control details</u> (i.e. gravel driveway and/or location of silt fence, if applicable).
- Existing and proposed <u>contours</u> in sufficient detail to show slopes, cuts, fills and drainage pattern.
