Associate Planner Dimsho presented the staff report dated July 10, 2019. A copy is included in the archive meeting packet. There were no ex-parte conflicts of interest, or bias in this matter. There was no objection from the audience for the Council to make a fair decision. The Planning Commission recommends approval of the Comprehensive Plan Amendment.

Councilor Locke thinks this is more of a 10-year plan rather than a 20-year plan based on current growth.

Council President Morten asked if the cottage cluster concept fits into high density or mixed use. Dimsho responded that they haven't developed the cottage cluster code yet. The goal is to develop it by 2020. It depends on what density you apply to it. It can range from high to low.
