If you are proposing a **Home Occupation** within the City of St. Helens, please submit this form with the General Land Use application. This is required for a complete application.

Per St. Helens Municipal Code Section 17.120.070, the following is required for Home Occupation applications:

(1) One copy of the applicant's statement or narrative which explains how the proposal conforms to the approval criteria in SHMC 17.120.040.

The criteria for 17.120.040 are listed below. Please respond to the criteria below and sign this form. Use additional pages if necessary.

- (2) The required fee.
- (3) A site plan of the property drawn to scale with a north arrow indicated. The site plan shall show all major features of the property including buildings, major vegetation, access for public streets, sidewalks, any proposed exterior storage related to the home occupation per SHMC 17.120.040(13), etc.

The City may not require a site plan if the home occupation is going to be within the existing dwelling with no exterior modifications or use. Please discuss this with the Planning Department staff about what will be required.

- (4) One floor plan of all structures on the property which are to be used for the home occupation(s).
- (5) One title transfer instrument.

This is to provide proof of ownership. Usually, City staff can confirm ownership using electronic data. However, in circumstances where staff cannot verify ownership, a title transfer instrument may be necessary.

(6) Property owner's signature(s) or written authorization.

There is a place for the property owner to sign on the General Land Use application to meet this requirement.

As the applicant, you have the burden of proof to demonstrate how or why your home occupation will comply with City law. Please respond to the following criteria per St. Helens Municipal Code Section 17.120.040:
