Proposed Measure 5-298

City of St. Helens Local Option Tax Levy for Public Safety

Date of Election: May 21, 2024

St. Helens City Council has referred a measure to the May 2024 ballot. If passed by voters, the measure would authorize a five-year operating levy for police at a rate of \$0.69 per \$1,000 of assessed property value. The owner of a home assessed at \$200,000 would pay approximately \$138 per year or \$12 per month.

Voters will have the opportunity to consider the measure and the Enhanced Law Enforcement Operating Fund. If the measure passes, the City would use the tax revenue authorized by this measure to fund:

- Officer salaries
- Equipment
- Training

What happens if the measure does not pass?

If the measure does not pass, the salaries, equipment and training would not be funded as proposed and property taxes would not be increased.
